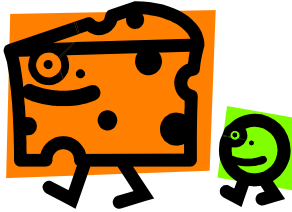

## December 5<sup>th</sup> Lunch

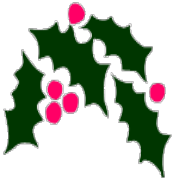

## Quiz Report

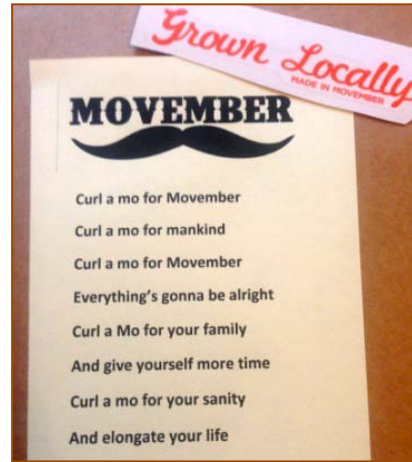

### Jeremy's Ride

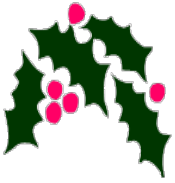
*Remember the article in our last newsletter asking for support for Jeremy Buckman's 'Churches Monsoon Ride'? Well, here is Jeremy's report on the event, waterlogged but successful!*



In the twenty-odd years that I've undertaken to do the Beds and Herts Sponsored Bike Ride for the Historic Churches Trust, this year topped the poll for the worst weather I've experienced! However, thanks to you and many others like you, I raised a total sponsorship of £827.00 and was determined to live up to your expectations and do the ride whatever the weather. Clad in warm layers and an (allegedly) waterproof jacket and trousers, I set off from home in Wingrave and visited the first church in Aston Abbotts at 10am, by which time it had started to pour with rain.

Onwards through Cublington, Wing, Mentmore, Cheddington and Slapton, I'd long passed worrying about being soaked; there comes a point where you can't get wetter, so you might as well carry on! Billington, Eaton Bray, Totternhoe and Ellesborough came next and I encountered so many dedicated 'meeters and greeters' bored by having so few customers and desperate to have someone sample their sandwiches, cakes and cups of tea. By this time you had to admire them for attempting to sign the sodden sheet of papier mache that was once my proof of visit to the church.

Over the fields on a bridleway to Ivinghoe, then on to Aldbury, Northchurch and to Berkhamsted, then to Tring, Aston Clinton and Buckland before being rewarded with sandwiches, cake and tea at my own



church, St Mary's at Puttenham at 4.30 in the afternoon. After setting off again and taking in All Saints at Long Marston, just three miles from home; would you believe the rain stopped and I had a dry(ish) ride back to Wingrave just in time to catch the booker-in at the URC church at 5.35pm before riding home to drip gently over the kitchen floor.



I'd cycled 51 miles, visited 29 churches in seven and a half hours and raised £827 to help the Historic Churches Trust to give grants to repair the fabric of our heritage of churches and that seemed to make it all seem worthwhile. Thank you all for your kind generosity!

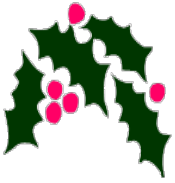
